If you contribute \$250 or more by any method other than payroll deduction, you will receive a tax acknowledgment letter from United Way at the beginning of the year. If you use payroll deduction, you will only receive a tax acknowledgment letter if your per-paycheck donation is \$250 or more, otherwise your year-end pay stub will reflect your total donation and serve as documentation in accordance with IRS regulations.

Credit Card Security Code

The card security code (CSC) is a 3- or 4-digit number printed on your card, rather than stamped in the plastic like the digits in your credit card number. The security code is not part of the credit card number. The CSC is a tool to prevent any fraudulent charges using your credit card, i.e. no one can pick up an old receipt of yours and use that information to fraudulently use your credit card because the CSC does not appear on receipts or statements. For American Express, the 4-digit number is printed on the front of the card, above and to the right of the embossed account number. On most cards, the CSC is printed on the back of the card (usually on the signature field). All or part of the card number appears before the CSC.
